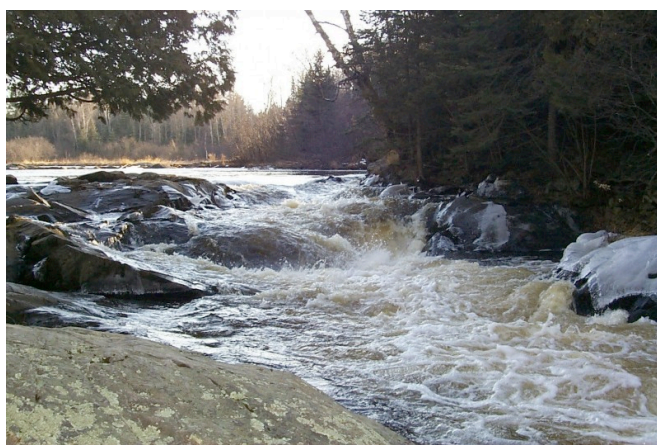


Burned Dam

Middle Branch Ontonagon River:

23 miles of canoeable/floatable river from FR 6110 (Russes Rd) 3 miles west of Watersmeet, MI to Bond Falls Flowage. Canoe access and parking is available at a Forest Service wayside in the town of Watersmeet where US45 crosses the river. At FR 5250 the river passes through old town of Interior which contains good dispersed camping areas. Bond Falls is located at the NW corner of Bond Falls Flowage. The site contains a boat landing, a small store, a picnic area, a and a private campground. The only hazard is the Mex-I-min-e Falls which must be portaged. There are no major rapids and the river is suitable for intermediate canoes year-round.
